

## 16-19 Tuition Fund 2022/23



The purpose of this statement is to set out how Bridge Training Ltd is planning to use its 16-19 tuition fund allocation to support students who may have had their learning disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The use of this fund will reflect the Bridge Trainings ethos of 'changing education, changing lives', and our commitment to supporting students in catching up on learning opportunities they have missed during the pandemic.

### **What is the Tuition Fund?**

The 16-19 Tuition Fund is a funding allocation being provided by the Government to support students to catch up and close any gaps in their learning that may have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 lockdowns.

The fund will be used for either 1-2-1 or small group tuition in English, Maths, and vocational subjects for those who have not yet secured a GCSE grade 4 in English and Maths. This tuition will be in addition to the planned study programme hours.

### **How will we use this?**

Sessions will be held in small groups (a maximum of 5) or 1-2-1 and will be timetabled in addition to the planned programme of learning. Sessions will be delivered face to face, online or through a blended learning delivery model.

Students will be selected for tuition by either the Student Support Lead or the teacher. Regard is being given to the requirements of disadvantaged students and students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). Those groups will be targeted for tuition to support them in their next steps.

### **Our commitment**

Bridge Training is committed to ensuring that the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government guidance:

- producing this statement setting out how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students.
- publishing this statement on our website
- recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who receive support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered and retaining the evidence of the tuition provided
- delivering the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2022/23.
